Would you rather be a pod racer like Anakin Skywalker or a swoop bike racer like Sebulba?

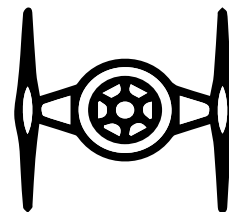
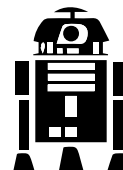
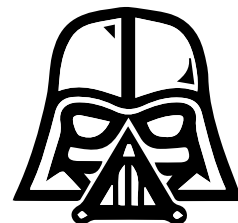
Would you rather have a droid sidekick like R2-D2 or a protocol droid like C-3PO?

Would you rather have a lightsaber duel with Darth Maul or Count Dooku?

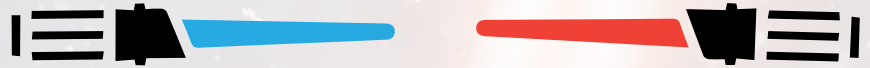

JEDI OBSTACLE COURSE

With this Jedi-themed obstacle course, young Padawans will embark on an exciting adventure while honing their agility, balance, and Jedi skills. May the Force be with them as they navigate each challenge and emerge victorious!

Course Introduction:



Set up a designated starting point with a Jedi-themed banner or sign welcoming young Padawans to the obstacle course. Provide each participant with a Jedi robe (if available) or a simple belt to wear as they embark on their training journey.

Obstacle 1: "Lightsaber Limbo"

Set up a limbo stick (or lightsaber, if available) at varying heights. Participants must channel their inner Jedi agility to limbo under the stick without touching it.

Play Star Wars music in the background to add to the atmosphere.



Obstacle 2: "Droid Dodging"

Scatter several droid (or cone) obstacles throughout a designated area. Participants must use their Force sensitivity to navigate through the obstacles without touching them.

Encourage creative movements reminiscent of Jedi dodging blaster fire.



Obstacle 3: "Balance Beam Training"

Place a narrow balance beam (or designated line on the ground) for participants to walk across.

Challenge participants to maintain their balance as they walk across the beam, pretending it's a precarious bridge over a chasm.

For added difficulty, incorporate foam "rocks" or obstacles that participants must step over or avoid.



Obstacle 4: "Force Field Maneuvering"

Hang streamers or ribbons (representing Force fields) across a pathway.

Participants must navigate through the "Force fields" without breaking or touching them.

Encourage participants to use subtle hand movements as if using the Force to part the barriers.



JEDI OBSTACLE COURSE

Obstacle 5: "Jedi Training Course"

Set up a series of cones or markers in a zigzag pattern. Participants must run or weave through the course, demonstrating their agility and speed. Time each participant to add a competitive element or encourage teamwork by having participants complete the course together.



Obstacle 6: "Final Duel"

Create a designated area for a lightsaber duel. Provide pool noodles or foam lightsabers for safe "combat." Participants pair up and engage in friendly duels, demonstrating their Jedi skills in a final showdown.



Obstacle 7: "Force Jump Training"

Set up a series of hula hoops or hoops of various sizes on the ground. Participants must leap from one hoop to the next, using the Force to propel themselves forward. Encourage participants to focus on their jumping technique, emphasizing height and distance.

Obstacle 8: "Blaster Blockade"

Hang inflated balloons or cardboard targets from a clothesline or tree branches. Participants must use their lightsaber skills to "deflect" imaginary blaster bolts by hitting the targets with foam balls or soft projectiles. Time each participant's accuracy and speed in hitting the targets.

Obstacle 9: "Astro Droid Rescue"

Place a toy astromech droid or plush droid at a distance from the participants. Participants must race to the droid, pick it up, and return to the starting point. For added difficulty, incorporate obstacles or hurdles that participants must navigate while carrying the droid.

Obstacle 10: "Force Balance Stones"

Set up a series of stepping stones or sturdy cushions in a pathway. Participants must carefully walk or hop across the stones, using their balance and concentration to avoid "falling." To increase the challenge, add variations in height or spacing between the stones.

DIY LIGHT SABER

This super cool DIY light saber is so simple and fun!

INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1: Cut a piece of duct tape to fit around the bottom each glow stick.

STEP 2: Cut smaller pieces of the black electrical tape to make a light saber design.

STEP 3: Use a red marker to make the on/off button.

STEP 4: Now break/crack your glow stick to activate your super cool DIY lights saber! It really glows!

SUPPLIES

Glow sticks
Duct tape
Electrical tape
Scissors
Red marker

THE SCIENCE

Glow sticks contain chemicals: fluorescent dyes and a chemical called hydrogen peroxide. The chemicals do not product any light until they are mixed together.

Inside the tube is a smaller tube made of super thin glass. When you crack the stick, the glass breaks inside, and the chemicals are allowed to mix. They react to make new chemicals and release energy in the form of light. Also, the warmer the glow stick, the brighter it will glow. A cold stick will not glow as brightly, but will glow for a longer period of time.

STEP 3: Color your designs with markers.

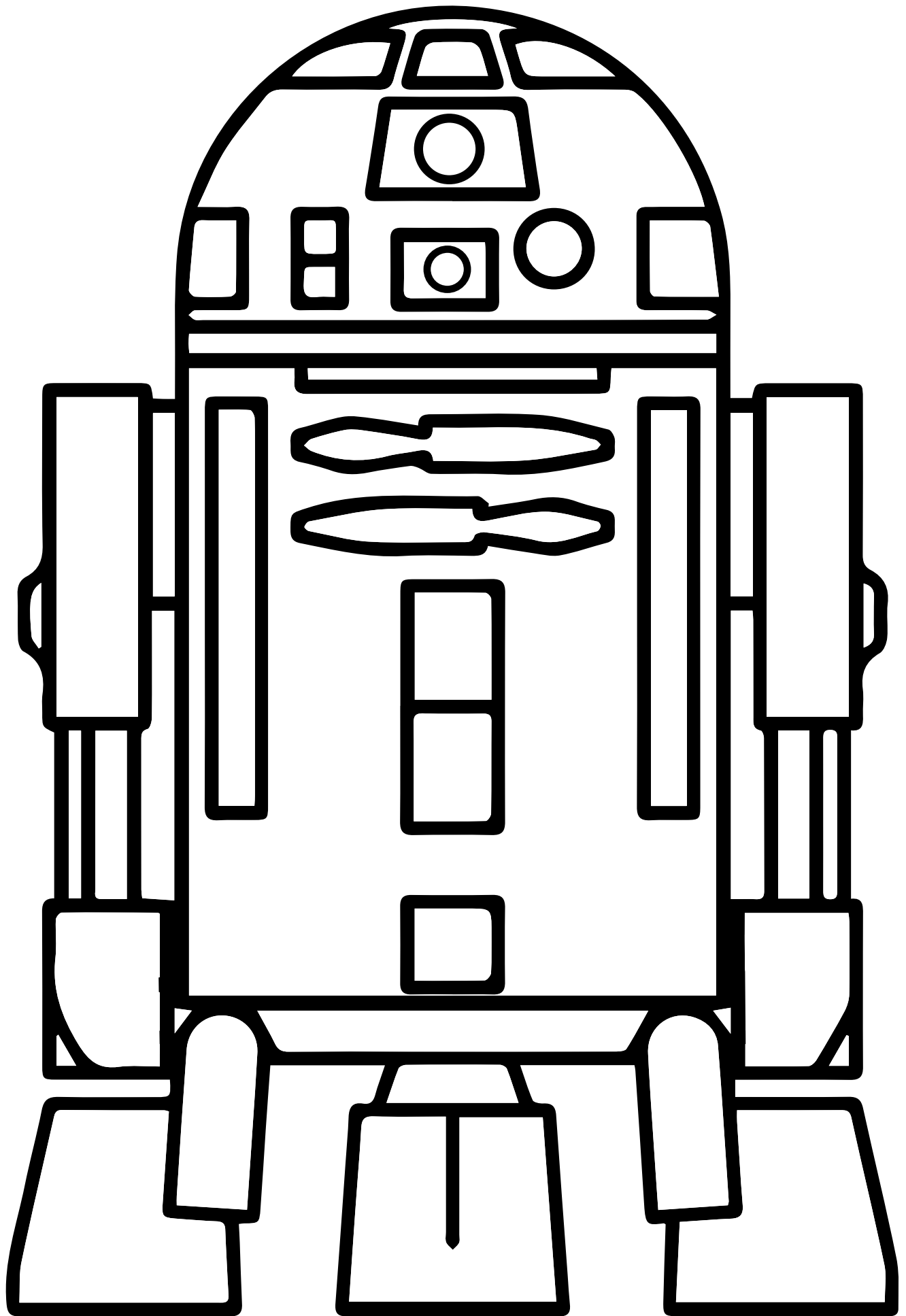

(Add a string and hang if you like)

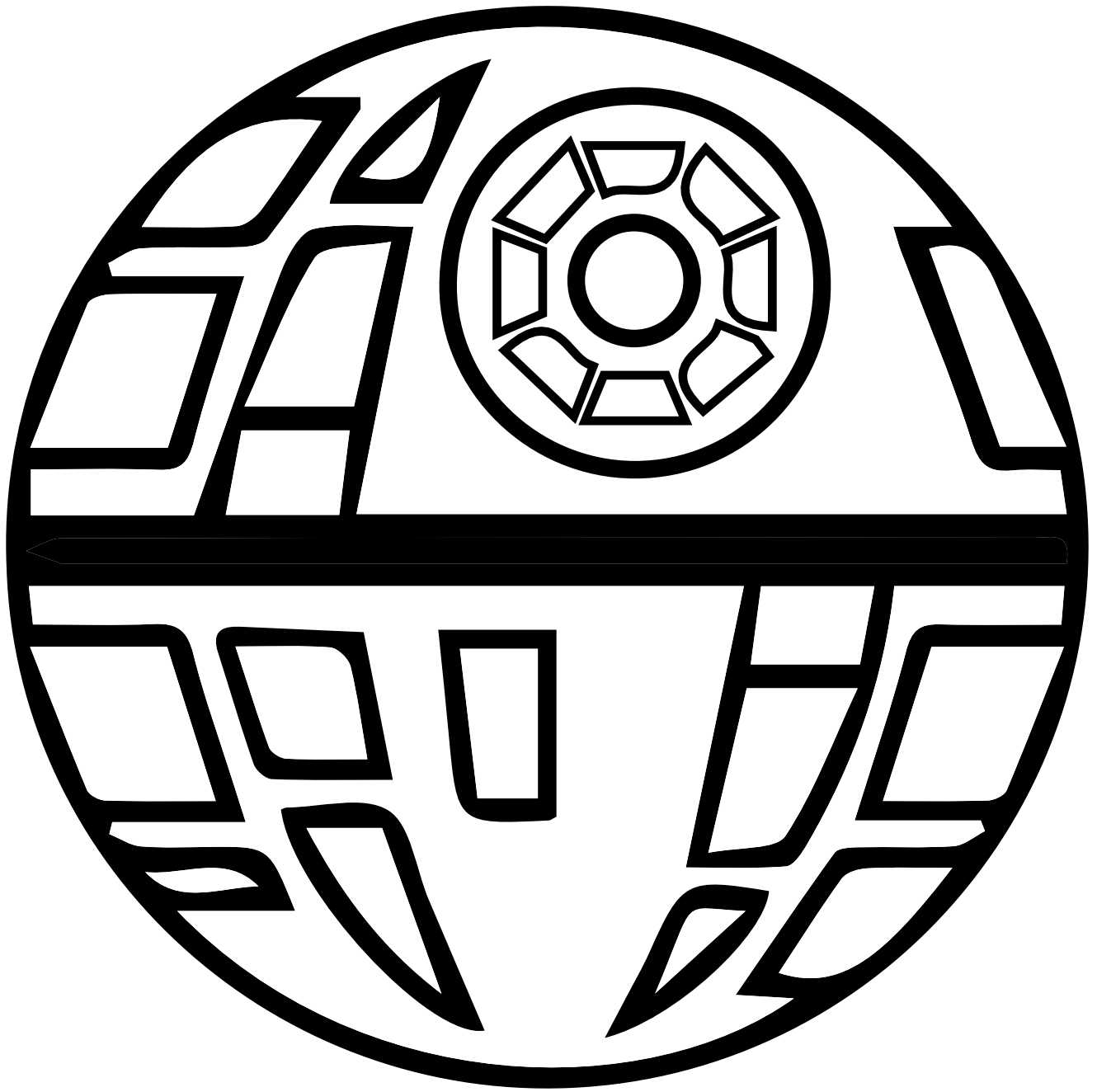

THE DEATH STAR

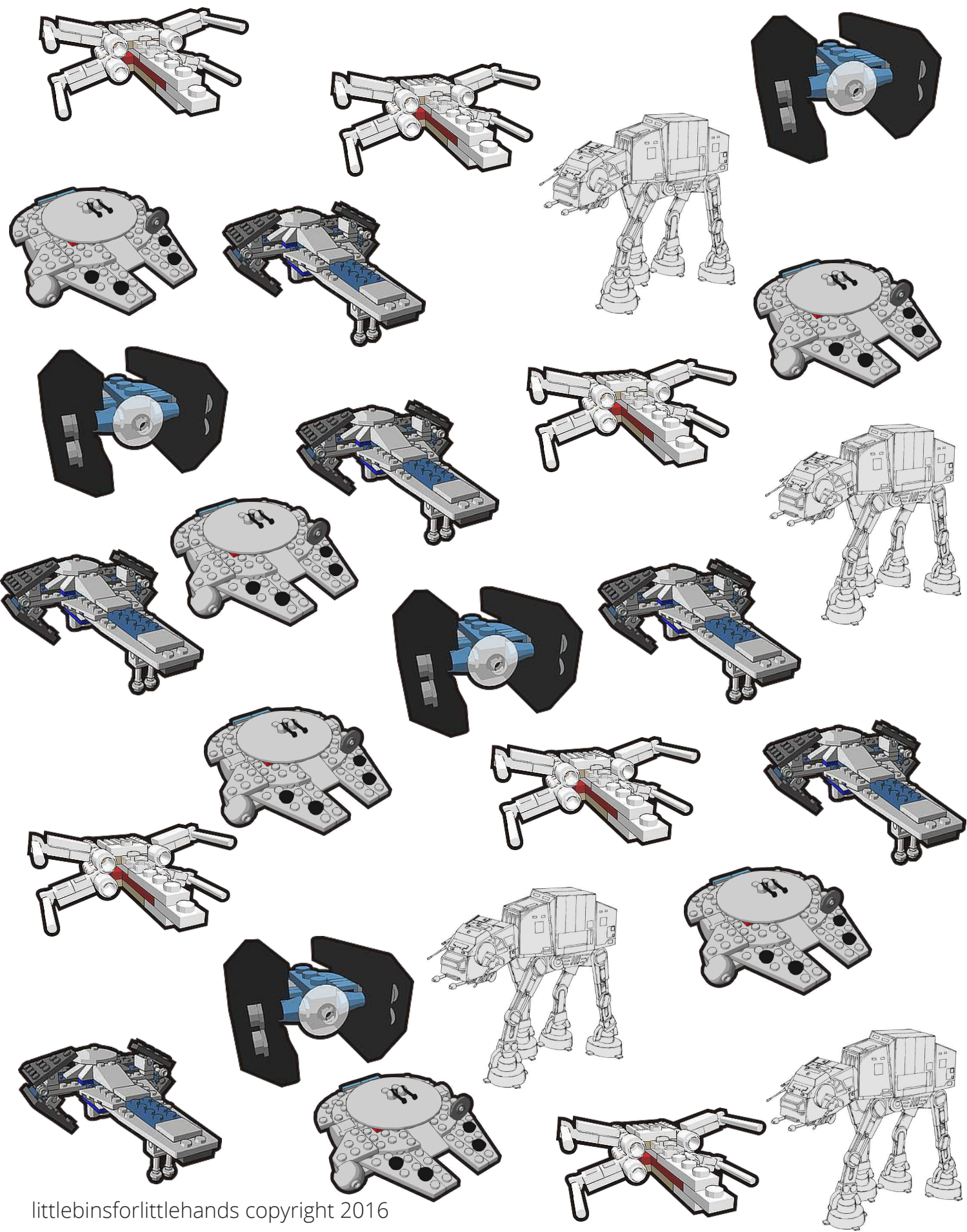
The Death Star is a fictional moon sized space station and galactic superweapon that was featured in the movie franchise Star Wars. They were armed with "kyber crystal-powered superlasers", which had the capability to destroy entire planets.

The sound of the Death Star counting down until it fires comes from the Flash Gordon movies. In the movie's main battle scene, the ghost of Obi-wan Kenobi tells Luke Skywalker to use the Force to help him launch the torpedoes into the core which destroyed the Death Star battle station.



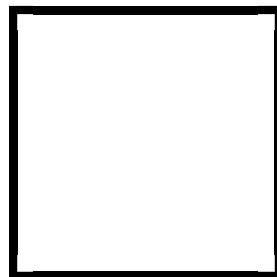
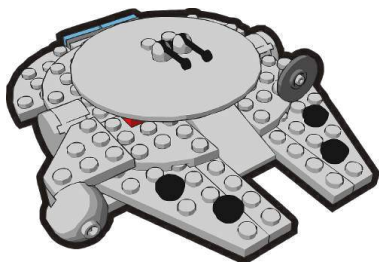
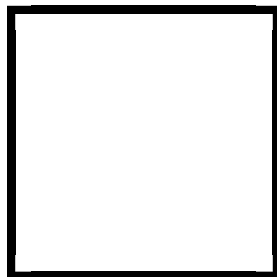
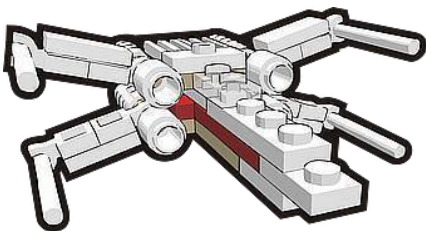
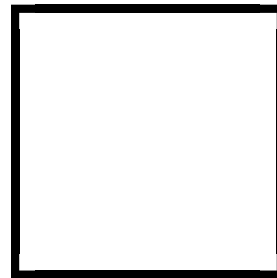
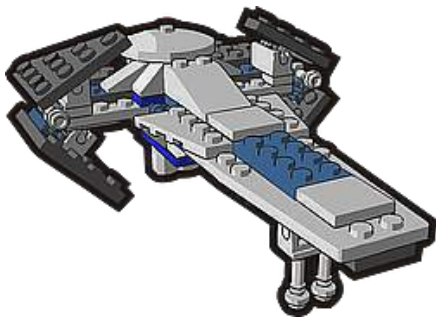
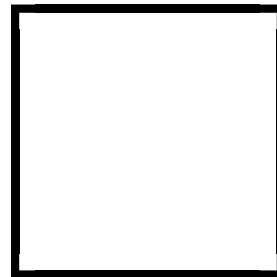
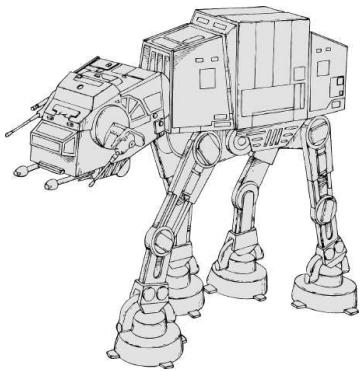
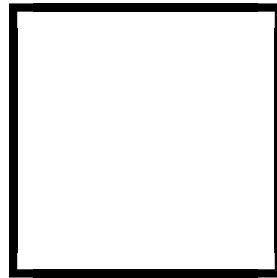
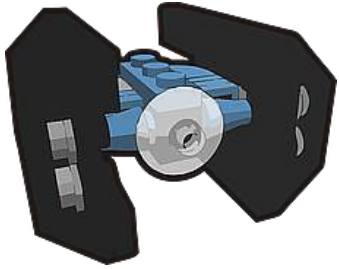

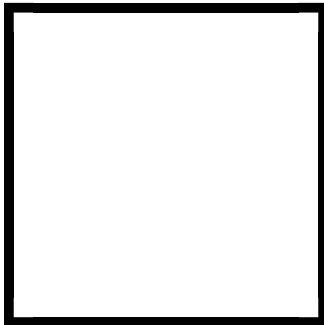
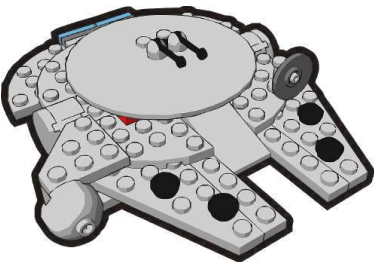
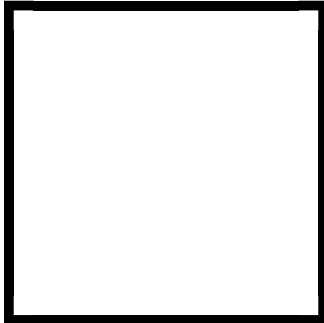
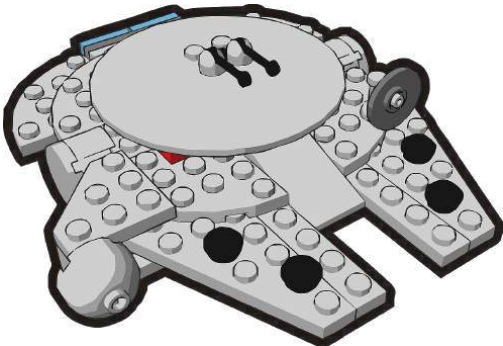
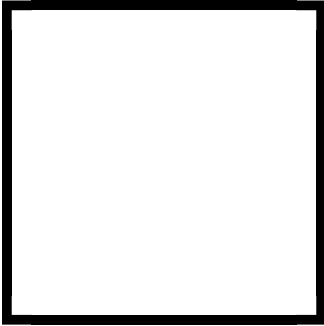
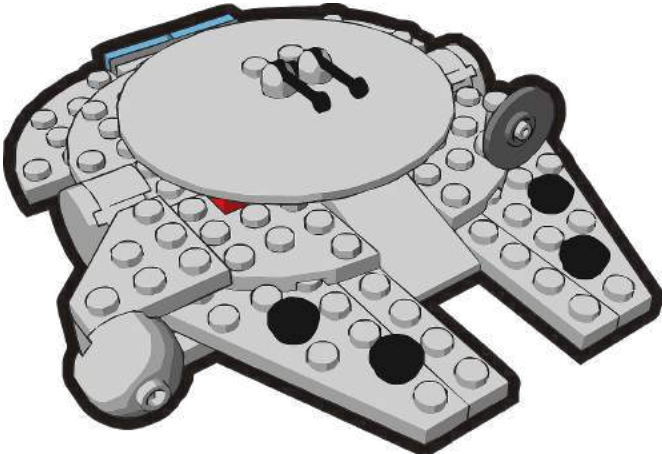
HOW MANY AT-ATS DO YOU SEE?

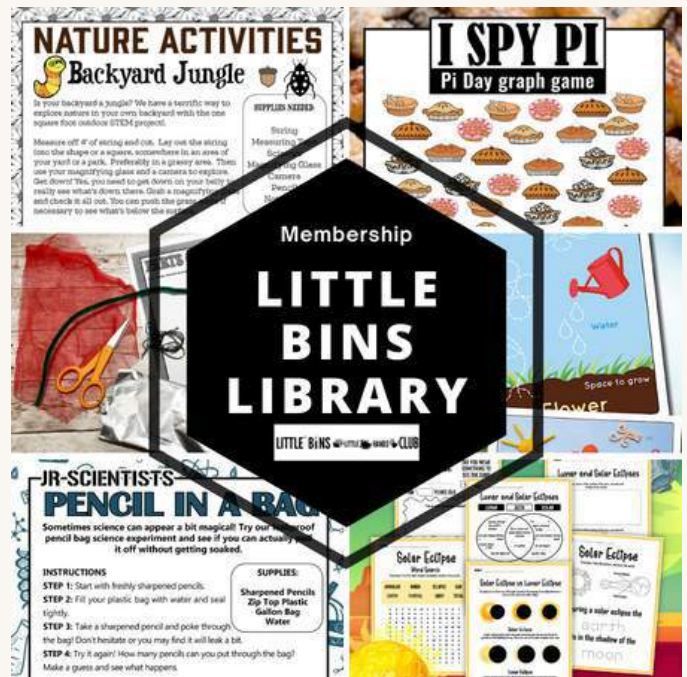

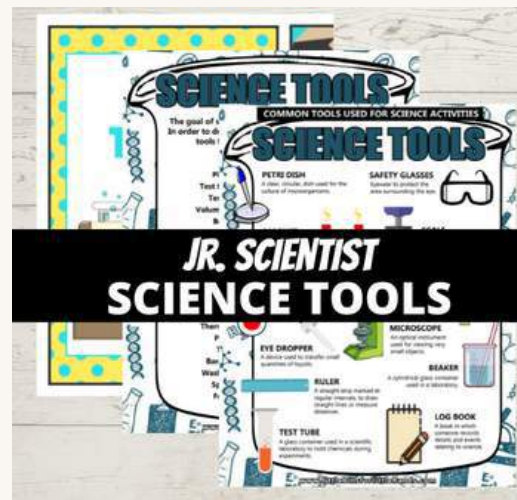
