ECHIDNA

Echidna is an egg-laying mammal. It lives in Australia. It has long spines to protect its body. Because of this, it is also known as the spiny anteater.

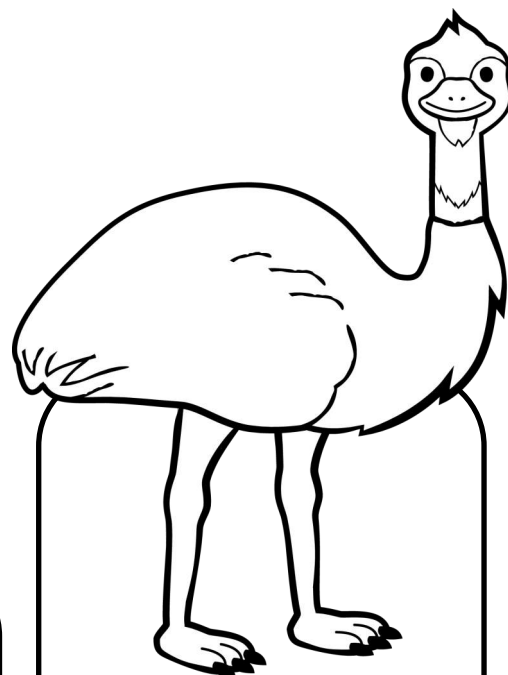
The echidna has a long, sticky tongue. It uses its tongue to eat insects such as termites and ants.



KOALA

Koalas are not bears. They are marsupials—mammals with pouches to carry their babies.

Koalas are nocturnal, which means they are active at night. They eat eucalyptus leaves throughout the night and spend up to 20 hours each day sleeping.

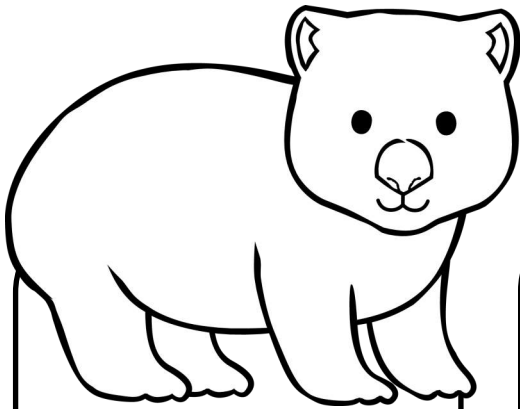


EMU

The emu is a large bird that cannot fly, but it can run. Emus can run up to 30 miles per hour!

Emus wander looking for food. They like to eat fruit, seeds, insects, and they even forage through animal droppings.

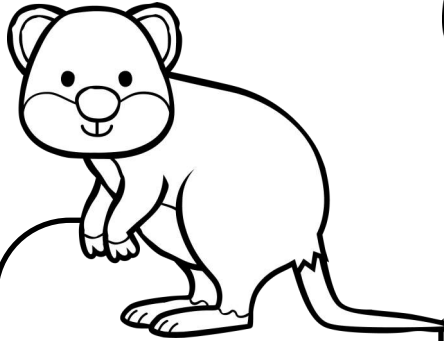
WOMBAT

The wombat is a close relative of the koala.

Wombats are marsupials and have pouches to carry their babies.

It lives in dry areas on the island of Australia.

This plant-eating animal is called an herbivore because it eats roots, leaves, grass, and bark.

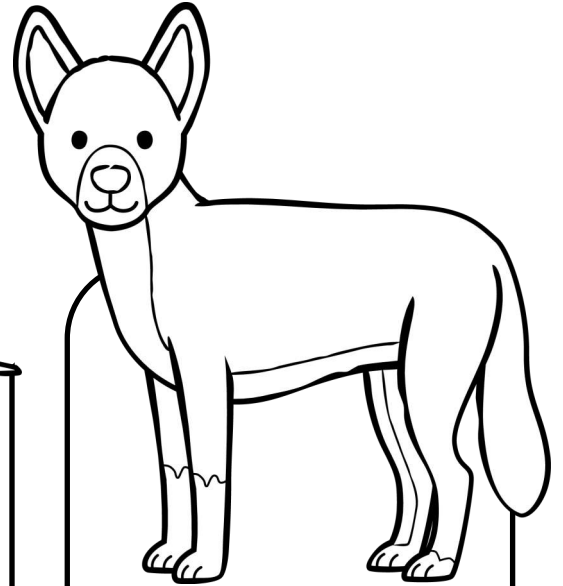


QUOKKA

Quokkas are about the size of teddy bears and weigh in around seven pounds.

They are marsupials, so they have pouches to carry their babies.

Male quokkas are called boomers while females are called fliers, and babies are called joeys.



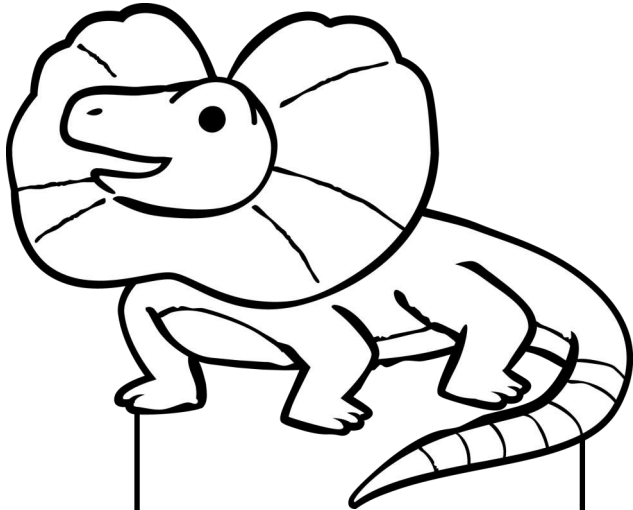
DINGO

The dingo is known as Australia's wild dog.

Some dingo live alone while others live in packs. They communicate with other dingo with howls sounding like wolves.

Dingo hunt rabbits, birds, lizards, and other small animals.

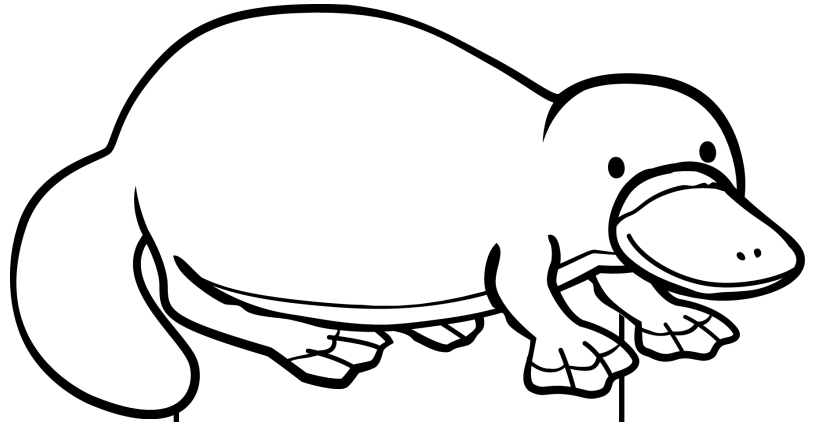

FRILLED LIZARD

The frilled lizard is a reptile with a fancy defense. It can display the frill around its head to frighten enemies.

When the frilled lizard is scared, it will run away by only using its back legs. This is why it has been nicknamed, "bicycle lizard."



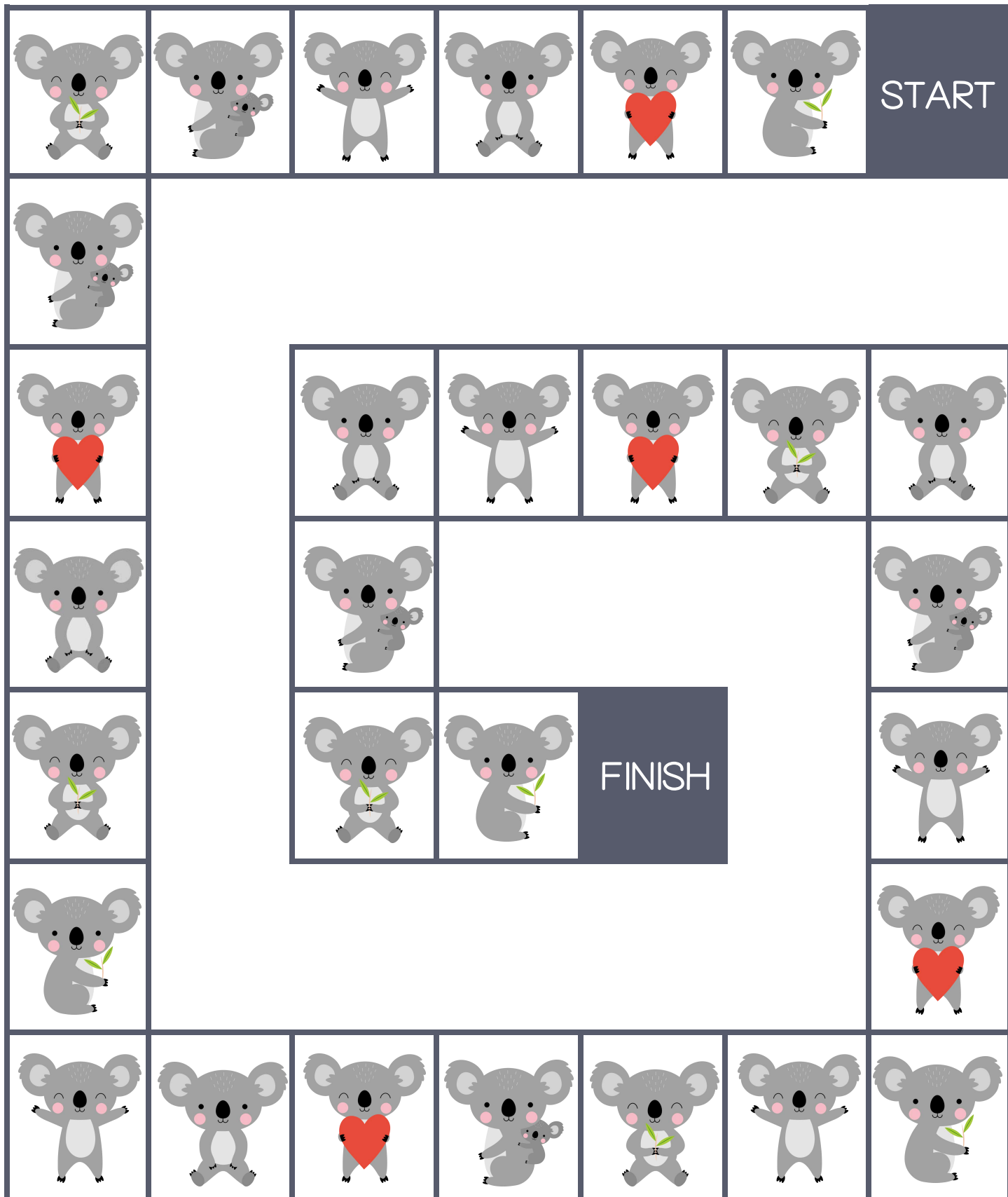
PLATYPUS

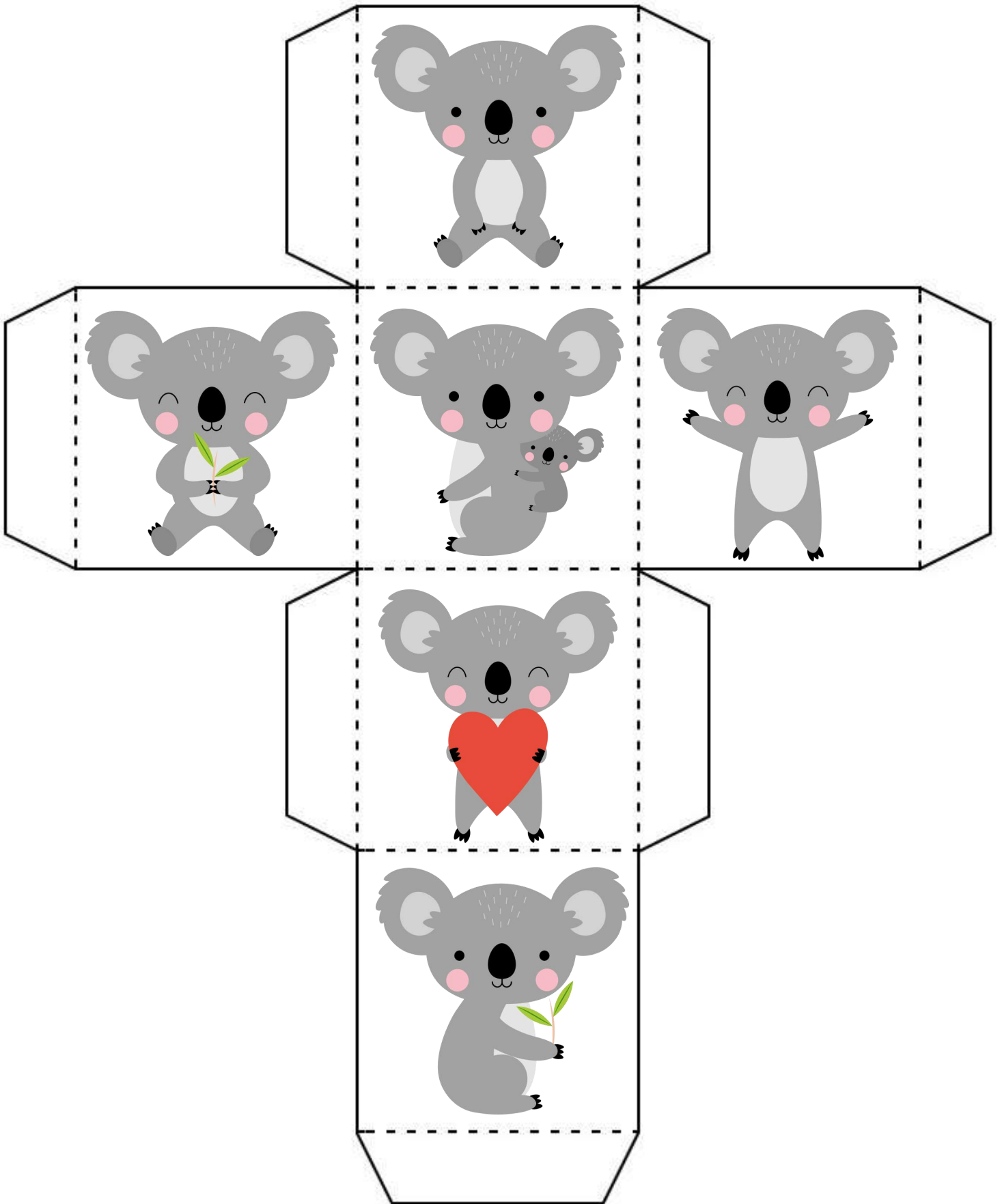
The platypus is a special kind of Australian mammal that lays eggs.

The platypus has other unique features: waterproof fur, a bill, and the males have a poisoned spike on their ankles.

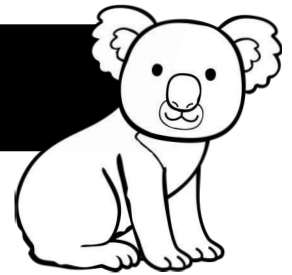
The platypus spends most of its time in freshwater.
